#### **Clarifying the last edition**

Both brothers Michael and Peter came from the Community of the Glorious Ascension in Stratford Park, now the Stroud Museum in the Park, Like vou. I have fond memories - I do recall that Peter was an Army boxing champion at some time before taking the robes and Michael was a "dab hand" with the water pistol!"

# **Obituaries**

Martin S. Burford (1960-65) died in June aged 59. Up Hatherley mourned the loss of their community stalwart and we our Newsletter editor since May 2005. He served as a parish councilor for eight years, and leaves his mother, Edna, son Andrew and brother David. The former fire prevention officer for Gloucestershire Fire and Rescue underwent emergency surgery to treat a lung infection in 2003 and had part of his left lung removed and he had to spend more than a month in hospital. Eight Old Boys attended a packed service at Up Hatherley, Cheltenham and when listening to the list of accomplishments read by the Parish Chairman, we were most honoured that Martin found time to produce our Newsletter.

Ronald G. Grange (1936-40) died in May leaving his wife and two sons. We were represented at his service at Cheltenham Crematorium. From school he was an apprentice Toolmaker at Daniels until his call up to the RAF.

His aunt was married to Mr.Tarn and he missed the last three years dinners. He had a brain tumour and deteriorated very quickly.

**Eric Wood (1928-32)** died in June aged 92. The youngest of 13 brothers and sisters, he served an apprenticeship at T.H.&J. Daniels but later became a successful antique dealer.

Aden veteran and our Old Boy Chris Blick met the Prime Minister at a Downing Street reception to mark the launch of the new Armed Forces Day. Mr. Blick, who served in catering with the RAF during the insurgency in the 1960s, joined Stroud MP David Drew at the event at Number 10. The reception was hosted by Gordon Brown and was held in honour of veterans and those still serving in Britain's Army, Navy and Air Force.

This year saw the first national Armed Forces Day. It recognised the huge contribution made to the country by those who have served or are still serving in the forces. Events around the country included a national celebration at the Royal Naval Dockyards in Chatham. "It was a great honour to be invited to Number 10 Downing Street and actually speak and shake hands with both Gordon Brown and his wife Sarah," said Mr Blick, who helped to form the Gloucestershire Aden Veterans' Association in April 2008.
